Organized in April 1862, the unit consisted of two companies, the first of which was organized at Yankton and the second at Sioux City, Iowa. The battalion defended the frontier and operated against hostile Indians. At the battle of Killdeer Mountain on 28 July and other engagements 6–9 August against the Sioux, there were six men lost.

The file of a soldier could contain enlistment papers, substitute certificates, casualty sheets, death reports, and correspondence. The last roll contains miscellaneous cards for which no service file could be established.
