Heir Indexes list a family representative at whose instance the baptism was performed while **Baptism registers** contain name, birthdate/place and sometimes parents of the person for whom the baptism was performed along with the names of the heir and proxy. **Baptism Certificates/Statements** consist of heir and proxy lists and statements certifying that the listed baptisms have been performed.

There were two Mormon organizations that served in the Mexican War. The Mormon Battalion, Volunteers, was organized at Council Bluffs, Iowa, on 16 July 1846. The five companies were en route to California and enlisted for one year. At the expiration of their enlistment, only one company opted to reenroll at Los Angeles, California, on 20 July 1847. Known as Capt. Davis' Company A, Mormon Volunteers, the unit served six months.
