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There are two sections of this work. One is alphabetical by the name of locatee. It sometimes gives his or her place of residence, the town/ city, conc., date, and the type of transaction. The other section is by township.

The information is derived from the Crown Lands Papers, the Canada Company Papers, and the Peter Robinson Papers. It refers to the initial inalienation of land resulting in a patent. The data range from the 1780s to the beginning of World War I.

Loiselle Marriage Index.

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Pere Antoine Loiselle prepared this index of marriages in Quebec between 1939 and 1963. He covered the period from 1750 and 1963 and featured one million records from 520 parishes. He covered the Quebec region and the neighboring counties of Trois Rivières, Nicolet, the area and north of Montreal, Saint Hyacinthe, Sherbrooke, Joliette, Saint Jean, and Valleyfield. In addition there are a number of parishes from the Ottawa region, Mont Laurier, Suguenay and Gaspésie. Areas outside of Quebec featured are the Vallée de la Madawaska, New Brunswick, and Massachusetts.

One set is arranged by groom [homme] and the other is by bride [femme]. The entries are arranged in alphabetical order with the surname and forename of the groom followed by his father's forename and his mother's forename and surname, the surname and forename of the bride, her father's forename and her mother's forename and surname, the parish and the date of marriage [year dash day slash month]. Entries having the same names of the parties are further arranged in chronological order by the date of the marriage.

An example of an entry is:

Beaupre/Marcel/Joseph/Florida /Cote

Lemelin/Rose/Josaphat/Marianne/Drouin/St. Valerien, 1938—27/5.
