These are the records of the staff of General William Henry Harrison, Governor of Indiana Territory, and include volunteers from both the Indiana territorial and Kentucky militias as well as the Regular Army. Muster rolls contain the names of the soldiers, their rank, dates of service, and remarks. In addition to these data, the pay rolls also include the amount of pay.

This index contains about 100,000 entries taken from 537 sources. Entries appear for individuals who have a biographical sketches in such sources as county histories and atlases. In the latter will often appear lists of residents with their names, birth date, and/or birth place, and such references have been incorporated into the index. The index excludes all other individuals other than the biographee, e.g., parents, spouses, children, siblings, daughters-and sons-in-law. Women are listed under both their maiden and married names.

The Papers of William Henry Harrison, 1800–1815.

The ninth President of the United States, William Henry Harrison had the shortest tenure of anyone to hold that office. He entered the United States Army in 1791 and was assigned to Fort Washington located at what would become Cincinnati, Ohio. He fought at the Battle of Fallen Timbers in 1794. His wife was the daughter of Judge John Cleves Symmes of New Jersey who was the land speculator in the area of Ohio known as the Symmes Purchase west of Cincinnati. Harrison was secretary of the Northwest Territory from 1798 and entered Congress the following year. He became governor of Indiana Territory in 1801. He also assumed control of Louisiana Territory in 1804.

During the War of 1812, he became a major general in Kentucky and shortly thereafter was named to head the Northwest Army. He was victorious at the Battle of the Thames where Tecumseh was killed. After the war he served in the House of Representatives, the Senate, and as minister to Colombia. With strong support from veterans of the War of 1812 and the Anti-Masonic Party, he won the election for the presidency in 1840.

This collection of his papers includes letters he wrote and received, petitions he received, territorial appointments he made, messages to and from the Indiana Territorial General Assembly, congressional reports, Indian treaties, deeds, court cases, military orders, accounts, and checks. The documents are arranged chronologically. Accompany the set is *A Guide to the Papers of William Henry Harrison, 1800–1815* which is a calendar of the documents on each roll.

The records are arranged by county, and 68 Indiana counties are included. The coverage for births and deaths spans 1882 to 1920. Marriage records may vary for the county concerned. Allen County, for example, marriages are featured from 1824 to 1920. In some cases there will be other records such as poll tax lists, voter registration lists, and census reports. The counties for which births and deaths are included are: Adams, Allen, Bartholomew, Benton, Boone, Carroll, Cass, Clark, Clay, Clinton, Daviess, Dekalb, Delaware, Elkhart, Floyd, Fountain, Franklin, Fulton, Gibson, Greene, Hamilton, Hancock, Harrison, Hendricks, Henry, Howard, Huntington, Jackson, Jasper, Jay, Johnson, Knox, Kosciusko, Lagrange, Lake, Laporte, Madison, Marion, Martin, Miami, Monroe, Montgomery, Morgan, Newton, Orange, Owen, Parke, Perry, Pike, Posey, Pulaski, Putnam, St. Joseph, Shelby, Spencer, Starke, Sullivan, Tippecanoe, Vanderburgh, Vermillion, Vigo, Warren, Warrick, Washington, Wayne, Wells, and White.

The registration of vital statistics in Indiana between 1882 and 1920 in urban areas was a matter for municipal rather than county government. Accordingly, knowing the county may not be sufficient to determine if a record exists. For example, in addition to the entries for Lake County, one would also need to check the records for the municipalities of Crown Point, Gary, Hammond, Hobart, and Whiting.
