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## Land

### *Georgia Surveyor General Land Grants, 1756–1912.*

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There are 1,474,699 land grants and plats. The bounty and headright grants are followed by the land lotteries held in 1805, 1807, 1820, 1827, and 1832 as well as the 1832 gold lottery.

Access to the bounty and headright grants is available through Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas's *Index to the Headright and Bounty Grants of Georgia*, R929.3758/L933I/1982.

Pat Bryant's *Entry of Claims for Georgia Landholders 1733–1755*, R929.3758/G325E/1975 gives the claims of more than a thousand claimants Who registered in 1755 before the Royal Provincial era and gave a description of their holdings giving how and when they had acquired them. Some recite the chain of title.

Since colonial Georgia was not divided into counties, the parishes of the Church of England provides the means to identifying the location of land. Each colonist seeking land had to appear before the governor and council So the records of that body contain many important details about former Places of residence and other names of members in the household. The three Volumes have been abstracted by Mary B Warren as *Georgia Governor and Council Journals, 1753–1760, 1761–1767, 1772–1773*, ~~R975.8/W253G~~ R929.3758 W291G

Another source of colonial land records is that of memorials. These have Been abstracted by Eve B. Weeks as *Georgia Land Owners Memorials, 1758–1776*, R929.3758/W395G/1988.

In an attempt to attract more settlers after independence, Georgia Instituted a policy of land lotteries in order to give the former Indian lands. There were held in 1805, 1807, 1820, 1821, 1827, and 1832 [both land and gold].

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The heirs or legal representatives of a Revolutionary pensioner were entitled to the unpaid balance of the pensioner due him or her to the time of his or her death. If the heirs or legal representatives claimed what was due, there may have been a final pension payment to the widow, the children, or others. Accordingly, the final payment vouchers not only provide proof of the date and place of death of the pensioner but also of filiation.

These payment vouchers are arranged in alphabetical order. There is an alphabetical appendix on the first roll. It gives the name of the pensioner, the name of the spouse who is usually the veteran on whose service the pension is based, the pensioner's county of residence, previous county or counties of residence in Georgia or elsewhere, military service of the veteran including rank and organization, Congressional pension act covering the claim; monetary provisions; the final pension payment amount; the date of the last pension payment was made; and miscellaneous information such as the name of the attorney, executor, or administrator handling the claim. Some of the files contain the names of widows and children. A few of the vouchers are for service in the War of 1812 and the Mexican War.

## Military—Indian Wars (1815–1858)

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These are the accounts of the payment of claims relating to campaigns against the Indians on the Georgia frontier, 1792–94. Governor Edward Telfair requested federal assistance when hostilities erupted between the Creek Indians and the settlers. President George Washington refused the request, but Secretary of War Henry Knox recommended that the state militia be used. The federal government furnished arms and ammunition to be used only in defensive operations. Because the Georgians waged an offensive campaign, Congress refused approval of the claims for many years. It was not until 1827 that Congress authorized the payment of the claims from members of the Georgia militia. They were paid from April to November 1827. The vouchers consist of a certificate with the soldier's name, rank, company, period of service, amount paid, and the payment date. There may also be personal papers such as discharges and identity papers. Due to the lapse in time from the service to payment, the claims may be filed by not only the claimants but also by the heirs, an administrator, or an assignee.

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A pension file gives the applicant's military service, his state and county of residence, and his economic status including the value of his property and the amount of current earnings. There may also be related documents from physicians and neighbors. A widow had to include the date of her marriage and a statement that she had not remarried. She may have done so by including her marriage certificate.

Georgia first awarded Confederate pensions in 1879. Widows first became eligible in 1891. Applicants had to have been residents of Georgia, but the service could have been rendered in any Confederate unit.

The records are arranged alphabetically by county and thereunder by name of applicant.

Georgia Confederate pensions are arranged in three series: main series, first supplement, and second supplement. The latter has not been microfilmed and is, therefore, not included in this series. Access to the first and second supplements is via Ted O. Brooke and Linda Woodward Geiger's *Index to Georgia's Confederate Pension Supplements*, R973.7458/ B872I/1999. It gives the name of the applicant, county of residence, supplement number, and box number.

This card file index not only shows the name of the soldier applicant or his widow but also the names of witnesses who testified in behalf of the applications of others. The index card also shows the county of residence, military unit, and the name of the spouse of widows.

It is virtually a statewide census of all males between the ages of 16 and 60 who were not already in Confederate service. It lists some 42,000 men many of whom were able to serve in local militia companies. The census gives the name of the person, his age, occupation, place of birth, and reason, if any, for his exemption from military service. There are no lists for the counties of Burke, Catoosa, Chattooga, Dade, Dooly, Emanuel, Irwin, Johnson, Pulaski, or Wilcox.

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These are the muster-in rolls of the Georgia militia in 1916. An entry gives the name of the soldier; rank; age; height; complexion; eye color; hair color; town/county state of birth; occupation; whether married or single; residence; name, relationship, and address of next of kin; date of commission; home station or company rendezvous place and date; date of subscription oath; date of expiration of enlistment; and remarks. The records are arranged by unit; there is no index. Many of the entries are illegible.

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This is the voluminous card file of information on individuals from throughout the Southeast assembled by the Georgia genealogist, Leon S. Hollingsworth (1896–1974). There are some 45,000 cards on which are recorded names of persons together with genealogical data gleaned from wills, administrations, deeds, marriage records, Bible records, &c. Following the nominal portion is a separate index entitled “Place Names” which also includes some topics. The nominal section is alphabetical by surname with cross references from alternative spellings. One should consult all possible variants of a particular surname. The entries are randomly arranged within each surname.

The book, *Leon S. Hollingsworth Genealogical Card File, an Introduction and Inventory*, R939.373/H741YH, consists of a list of surnames with the total number of cards per name featured in the collection.
